

The dream of the sports car becomes reality before your eyes at the Porsche Museum, where you can delve deep into the exciting world of Porsche. Covering 5,600 square metres, the exhibition area is filled with legendary racing cars, iconic road models and fascinating prototypes and studies. More than 80 vehicles are just waiting to be discovered – and heard – but there is also plenty to discover away from the main exhibition. Besides culinary and cultural delights, an adventure awaits our younger guests too.

At the end of the exhibition tour, it's time to get interactive: the Porsche Touch Wall takes you on a virtual journey in time thanks to some exciting high-tech features. You can also watch live demonstrations of some of the restoration work that is carried out on the classic Porsche cars in the Museum Workshop, as the team prepares them for their journeys around the world.

Situated above the workshop is the 'memory' of Porsche AG — the Porsche Company Archives. Housing around two kilometres' worth of files, it is where all the company's information is stored, from the economic, technical, social and cultural aspects to around 1,700 hours of film footage and 2.5 million photos.

You can take a pit stop at any time during your visit at the coffee bar, Bistro Boxenstopp or the Christophorus Restaurant. Meanwhile, our museum shop offers plenty to set the hearts of young and old Porsche fans racing.

### Public and private guided tours

Experience the company history of the Zuffenhausen sports car manufacturer. During the tour you get exciting insights and discover stories relating to the current exhibition in the Porsche Museum. We offer these guided tours for a maximum of 20 people in a closed group or together with other guests.

#### Awareness tour

In the 90-minute awareness tour, you experience and participate in the history of Porsche from a completely different perspective. The focus of this tour is on increasing self-awareness. The tour is also suitable as a team-building exercise. The minimum age requirement is 12 years of age.

### Guided tour for persons with disabilities

We offer guided tours for people with hearing or visual impairment, as well as tours in simple language. Please note that sign language interpreters must be organised by tour participants themselves.

In the Porsche Museum, children can explore the history of Porsche on their own at the **Porsche 4Kids Explorer Stages** integrated into the exhibition, solving a whole range of creative and tricky tasks along the way. The accompanying Explorer Book is available at the ticket desks free of charge. **Porsche 4Kids** Tours and the free **Porsche 4Kids Multimedia Guide** explain the exhibition for children.

Ever thought about celebrating a birthday surrounded by more than 30,000 PS? A **Porsche 4Kids Birthday Party** can be themed around Motor Sports, Design or the Future, with those attending getting the opportunity to be a racing driver, designer or researcher for the day.

The **Porsche 4School Teamspirits** have been designed as a series of four digital workshops in cooperation with the publishers Klett MINT, for grades five to 13, and comply with the educational curriculum. Up to 30 children or young people can take part, and at the end of each session the winning team is awarded a prize. You can choose between themes such as Automotive Design, Engine Technology, Aerodynamics & Lightweight Engineering, and Electromobility.





## Corporate Archives and Museum Workshop

We preserve our history. And put it onto the road.

With a history stretching back more than 100 years, there are a lot of stories to keep alive. We're talking two kilometres of files, 2.5 million photos and slides, 4,500 books, 1,700 hours of film footage, 7,300 posters and advertisements and around 25,000 small exhibits — all of which are carefully stored within the Porsche Company Archives.

In order to keep our car collection real and roadworthy, we have our own Museum Workshop, where the historic racing and sports cars are maintained and serviced to prepare them for rallying, events and tours, and the rest of the collection is kept in tip-top condition. The workshop team also carries out full restorations as well as any remedial work.

# Preparation is key – not just on the race track. The Porsche Museum essentials at a glance.

### 18 Admission Charges

Adults: 12 euros (concessions: 6 euros).

**Evening ticket**: from 5 p.m.: 6 euros (concessions: 3 euros). Children up to 14 years old and accompanied by an adult are entitled to free admission. For groups of 10 people or more without a guided tour, admission costs 10 euros per person including a multimedia guide.

Our visitor service can provide more information about the range of guided tours on offer, as well as the available programmes for children and school parties.

### **Parking Facilities**

We offer ample parking facilities during opening times in our underground car park (subject to fee) as well as charging stations for electric vehicles. There are also parking spaces available for buses, camper vans and motorcycles. Please follow the corresponding signs.

#### Multimedia Guide

On request, every guest will receive an electronic Multimedia Guide free-of-charge. This includes information, photo and film material on the individual vehicles. A children's version is also available for our younger visitors.

### Accessibility

All areas of the museum have barrier-free access and can be accessed via ramps or the lift. Free parking is available for people with disabilities.

### Getting Here

### By Train via Stuttgart Main Station

The Porsche Museum is located beside the suburban Neuwirts-haus/Porscheplatz station, which can be reached by taking the suburban railway lines S6 to Weil der Stadt and S60 to Leonberg. For more information, see www.vvs.de. We recommend using public transport to travel to the museum.

### By Car

From the A 81 Stuttgart-Heilbronn or Heilbronn-Stuttgart, take exit 17 for 'Stuttgart-Zuffenhausen', direction B 10, followed by the Stuttgart-Neuwirtshaus exit. The Porscheplatz is reached by following the Schwieberdinger Straße/L 1143.

### From Stuttgart

Follow the B 10 towards the A 81 motorway. Take the exit signposted Korntal, turn right off the Stammheimer Straße and follow Adestraße. Turn right into Strohgäustraße, which will take you to the Porscheplatz.
